Proper noun: Words which name specific people, places, days and months, subjects, titles and languages. Always start with a capital letter. *Durban, Andisiwe, Monday, English, Generations* 

Adverbs: Words which tell how an action is done: run *quickly*; jump *high*; talk *loudly* 

Verbs: Words
which tell you what
someone is doing
(action): He
laughs, Babies cry;
The dog bites

Adjectives: Describing words which give information about the noun. Some adjectives compare: A <u>big</u> dog. A <u>bigger</u> dog. The <u>biggest</u> dog.
